ASSIGNMENT OF PROSPECTIVE TASK III SHOPPING MALL – ZOO – COFFEESHOP AND A SWEET SHOP

Note for the administrator

The administrator has the **Prospective Task III. assignment** ready (the child sheet, the Map, the game piece, and the worksheets Shopping mall - Zoo - Coffeeshop and a sweet shop)

- The administrator presents the child with the Assignment of Prospective Task III (client sheet).
- The child reads the assignment and the administrator checks whether the child understands it.
- The administrator assigns various background tasks to the child (using the Training of Executive functions worksheets).
- Then the child begins doing one of the tasks assigned by the administrator from the Training of Executive functions worksheets.
- At any time, the administrator taps three times on the table the call to do task 1 Shopping mall.
- (The client positions the game piece on a designated place on the map and selects the correct image from the work sheet Shopping mall, in this particular case black-and-green three-wheel rollerblades that cost up to 100 euros.)
- The child returns to the tasks in the background (the Training of Executive functions worksheets)
- At some point, the administrator asks the client to begin doing **task 2 ZOO** in **four minutes**.
- (The child positions the game piece on a designated place on the map and selects the correct image from the worksheet **ZOO**.)
- The child returns to the tasks in the background (the Training of Executive functions worksheets).
- The administrator shows the tree to the child the call to do task 3 Coffeeshop and a sweet shop.
- (The child positions the game piece on a designated place on the map and selects the correct image from the work sheet Coffeeshop and a sweet shop.)
- The child returns to the tasks in the background (the Training of Executive functions worksheets).

Note:

In the case of an event-based cue, the child begins to do the task after being presented with the image by the administrator.

In the case of a time-based task, the child observes the time and begins doing the task at the time specified in the assignment.





ASSIGNMENT OF PROSPECTIVE TASK III SHOPPING MALL – ZOO – COFFEESHOP AND A SWEET SHOP

Assignment for the child:

Today is your favourite day - it is the weekend and it is also your birthday! Your parents have planned a day full of wishes come true for you. First, you are going to visit a shopping mall with your parents and you will receive a pair of new rollerblades. You have been wishing for a three-wheel rollerblades even faster than these you have now. But your parents have one condition: the price must not exceed 100 euros. Also, you would like it if they were green-and-black. Now, you need to make your choice. **You start doing your task once the administrator taps on the table three times.**

Right after the shopping mall, you are going to the zoo with your parents. You go there regularly and you always want to catch up on new animals. This time, you would like to mainly see a lama, young wolves and a rhino. **You begin the task once the administrator gives you a time limit**.






